For nearly 30 years the bold and politically-charged art of Emory Douglas graced the back page of the Black Panther Party newspaper and inspired a generation of youth all over the world. On Friday, October 17, 2008, the exhibition of artwork and prints by Emory Douglas will open to the public at the Southwest Arts Center, 915 New Hope Road in Atlanta, Georgia at 7 p.m.

The art exhibit is one of several activities taking place Friday and Saturday, Oct 17 & 18 at the Southwest Arts Center, the Auburn Avenue Research Library and the campus of Georgia State University. The Art and Culture of the Black Panther Party Conference organized by the BPP Alumni Committee to commemorate the 42nd anniversary of one of the most influential organization for social change in American history. Workshops are scheduled for Saturday at Georgia State University Classroom South, 104 Decatur Street at Central Avenue and the Auburn Avenue Research Library, 101 Auburn Avenue in downtown Atlanta.
