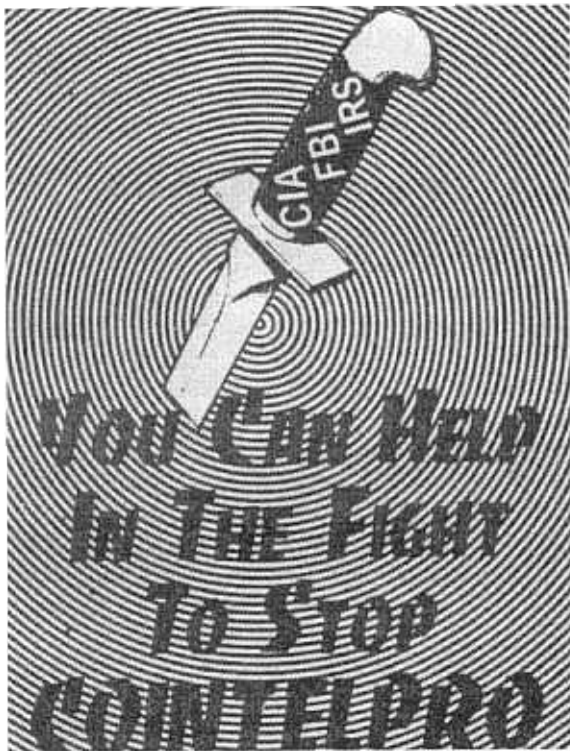

ROBERT LAWRENCE

Assassinated: August 25, 1968

Comrades Steve Bartholomew, Robert Lawrence and Tommy Lewis were riding in a car in Los Angeles on August 25, 1968, when they noticed that a Los Angeles Police Department squad car was following them. After being trailed for some time, the three Black Panther Party members stopped in a gas station so that any incident could be witnessed by many. As Steve, 21, was getting out of the car, a volley of police gunfire killed him instantly. Robert, 22, got out of the car to inquire why Steve was shot and he was also cut down in cold blood. Young Tommy Lewis, 18, was severely wounded by police gunfire as he left the car to defend himself, after seeing Steve and Robert murdered. Bleeding profusely, Tommy was left unattended for over two hours at Los Angeles' Central Receiving Hospital before he died from stomach wounds and loss of blood. Long Live the Spirit of Steve Bartholomew, Robert Lawrence and Tommy Lewis! Long Live the People's Struggle!

**WALTER
"TOURE"
POPE**

**Assassinated
October 18, 1969**



Walter "Toure" Pope joined the Black Panther Party as soon as he was released from the California Youth Authority, Tracy Penitentiary. Toure, who was only 20, quickly became singled out by the Los Angeles Police Department for his effectiveness in increasing the circulation of THE BLACK PANTHER in Southern California. In three months Toure increased our newspaper's circulation from 1,500 to 7,000 copies a week. After three false arrests, Toure's life became increasingly in danger. On October 18, 1969, Toure was gunned down brutally by the LAPD Metro Squad as he left a store where he had just dropped off some newspapers. Long Live the Spirit of Walter "Toure" Pope! SPURGEON "JAKE" WINTERS

**Assassinated:
November 13, 1969**



Before becoming a member of the Chicago Chapter of the Black Panther Party, Spurgeon "Jake" Winters was an honor student in school. After joining the Party, "Jake" worked on the Free Breakfast for Children program, at the Free Health Clinic and was part of the chapter's Education Cadre. Spurgeon "Jake" Winters was killed on November 13, 1969, when 100 Chicago policemen opened fire on him and another wounded Party member. It is said that three policemen died and seven were wounded in the attack on the deserted building where the two had taken refuge. Jake was only 19-years-old at the time of his death. Long Live the Spirit of Spurgeon "Jake" Winters! Long Live the People's Struggle!!

**Assassinated
October 26, 1974**



Bruce "Deacon" Washington, 26, died on October 26, 1974, as a result of gunshot wounds he received in the back while protecting the lives of children at a teen dance at the Oakland Community Learning Center (OCLC). Deacon, the father of two young children, was among those who daily strived to make the OCLC a haven not only for youth but for the entire community. His death was the direct result of a vicious police effort to destroy the Learning Center. Long Live the Spirit of Bruce "Deacon" Washington!! Long Live the People's Struggle!!

“L’IL” BOBBY HUTTON
Assassinated: April 6, 1968



Born on April 25, 1950, ‘L’il’ Bobby Hutton was one of the first members of the Black Panther Party, joining at the young age of 14. He was a very spirited, dedicated and hard-working young man, participating in numerous ‘Free Huey’ rallies. Bobby was one of those arrested on May 2, 1967, at the famous California legislature protest in Sacramento where the Party made public its position on self defense for Black and oppressed people.

On April 6, 1968, two days after the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr., ‘L’il’ Bobby James Hutton was brutally murdered by dozens of Oakland police who surrounded him and shot him down in cold blood after he had surrendered. Long Live the Spirit of ‘L’il’ Bobby Hutton!

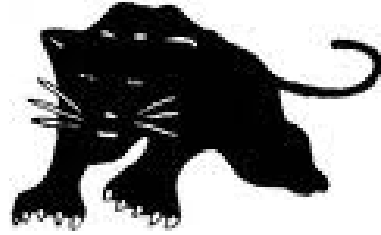
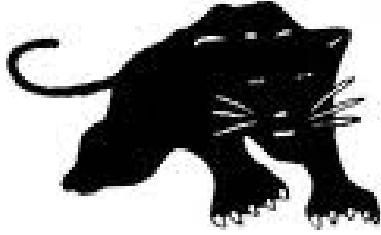
